Heras Fencing

Hera fencing a good idea but sometimes fragile.

The Issues

In order to provide a means of temporary fencing around a site, Heras Fencing is often employed. Whilst in general the stability of the fence is often very good it can however be susceptible to falling erected or located in positions that are exposed to high cross winds as can be seen in the picture on the below.



Good Practice

Should space allow, it is recommended to position additional fencing in a triangular formation to at least one side of the line of fencing at predetermined distances which should be considered during an initial Risk Assessment of the site fencing requirements. The triangular formation of fencing can be seen in the picture on the left
