

Wooden Pallet Re Use

To support the Galliford Try Half Waste to Landfill (HW2L) initiative an opportunity has been identified to reduce the quantity of waste wooden pallets requiring disposal, which also reduces the cost burden placed upon Galliford Try in paying for the disposal of waste pallets.

An external service provider, Scott ELM, will collect branded pallets (i.e., those pallets marked as belonging to an individual material supplier) from any Galliford Try construction site in England, Wales and Scotland at no cost providing that the pallets meet the criterion below.

How does it work?

Construction site teams need to ensure the following are met:

- A minimum of 30 pallets must be available for collection;
- Only branded and standard pallets (i.e., 1000x1200mm or 800x1200mm for standard unbranded pallets);
- The pallets are clean;
- No banding is left on the pallets; and
- A forklift truck is available for pallet loading.

Thereafter, construction site teams should call **0800 282488** and Scott ELM will collect the waste pallets for free.

How should the pallets be stored?

The pictures below show the do's and don'ts on how the waste pallets need to be stored / stacked.



Removal of these waste pallets from any Galliford Try construction site requires the completion of the Galliford Try Non Hazardous Waste Transfer Note (HS&E-FRM-W01-03).

Scott ELM retains documentation to assure compliance with statutory environmental legislation i.e., waste carrier licences and Environmental Permits / Waste Management Licences or Exemptions. If copies of this documentation are required, please contact your Regional Environmental Advisor.
