What?

Interserve operates a business management system, which includes an environmental policy and environmental controls. Our environmental management system is certified to the internationally recognised standard ISO 14001.

Why?

We need to manage, minimise and mitigate the environmental impacts of our construction activities. Reasons for doing this include:

- Our moral duty of care for the world we live in.
- Our clients' expectations that we operate in an environmentally responsible manner.
- Prosecutions following breaches of environmental law result in large fines, loss of production and increased insurance premiums.

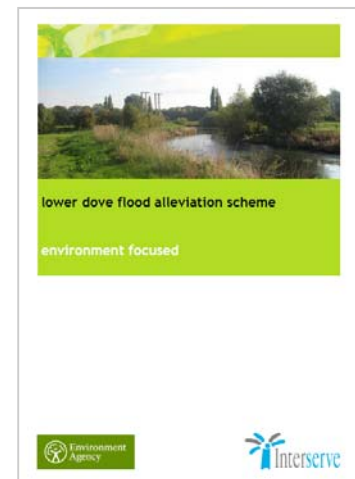
How?

We have committed to our **Environmental Policy**, including:

- Effective protection of the environment.
- Efficient use of natural resources.
- Awareness of all stakeholders.

The following basic rules to help us maintain our environmental performance apply on this site:

- Inspect all plant before use to ensure it is fit for purpose and well maintained.
- Avoid damage to plants and wildlife.
- Use drip trays for standing plant and refuel in designated areas.
- Clear up spillages as soon as practical, using appropriate spill response equipment.
- Store materials in designated areas to avoid damage and poor housekeeping.
- Segregate wastes into the designated facilities available on site.
- Report all environmental incidents to the site management.
- Refer any enquiries or complaints from the public or local inhabitants to the site management.
